This week I worked on the design document, project plan, and worked on preparing for our presentation. We think we should focus on this semester's final assignments and get some work in over break to continue next semester.

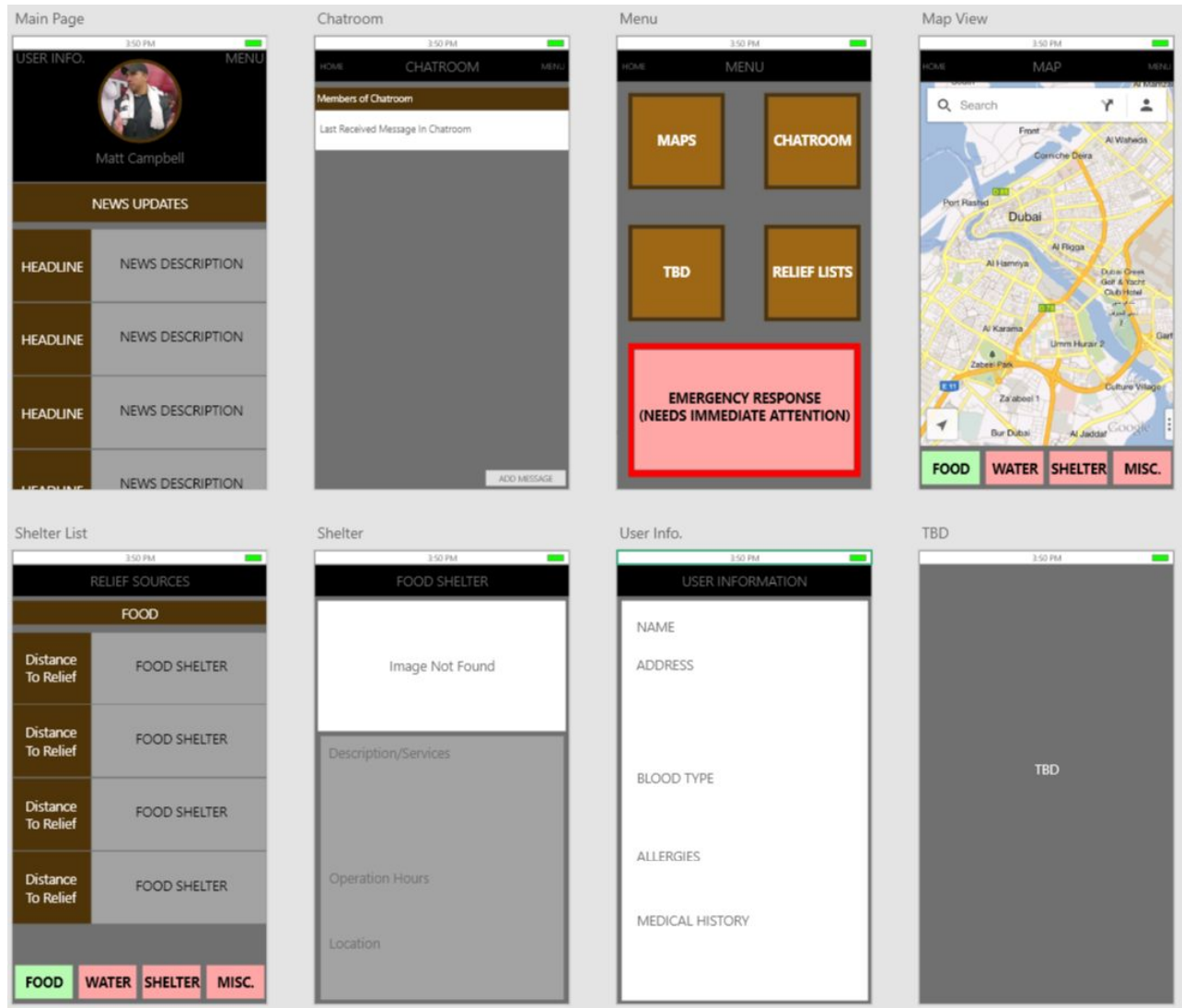
**Austin Keen** - Finalized Initial Mock Ups, and Finished UX/UI Focus Group Questions
